

What to Feed Your Frenchie

Not all food is created equal; some kibble could be lacking complete nutrition. Dogs also lack the enzymes in their system to break down and absorb all nutrients, so they get little out of some of the products they eat. Adding supplements to your dog's diet will help them receive a more nutrient-rich diet; this will give them better immune health, skin, coat, joints, and teeth, a good quality pre/probiotic will also help enzymes do their job by creating a healthy gut environment. To simplify, I have three supplements that will help aid in their diet and nutrition.

1. the right multivitamin
2. A high-quality Omega-3 (Not plant-based, use fish oil)
3. Probiotics and enzymes

Brewers Yeast, Multi-Vitamin, Omega, Probiotics & Enzymes, Folic Acid



For a well-rounded diet start with a high-quality kibble, and occasionally rotate between the available flavors. You may also switch to another high-quality brand; what some kibble may be lacking can be made up with a different brand or flavor. Do it gradually, and pumpkin is fabulous for constipation or diarrhea, one heaping tablespoon, when you are transitioning, does the trick.
